HALF RATIONS. In accordance with the law of Congress on the subject of impressments approved February 17th, 1864, to collect supplies for the army, the agents of the Commissary Department are now engaged in impressing meat in this county...

A LIST OF KILLED, WOUNDED, AND DECEASED IN THE 524 VA. INFANTRY REGIMENT. MARCH 21ST, 1864.—The following is a list of the killed, wounded and deceased in Capt. E. M. Dabney's Company "C," 524th Virginia Infantry Regiment, since the organization of the Company, July 16th, 1861.
