SARDINIAN BULLETIN.

Trieste, May 31. - A fresh victory has been gained by our troops. The King of Sardinia commencing the Fourth Division in person, accompanied at the head of the 1st Regiment of Heavy Cavalry, retook the stock for a considerable time, and then, having successfully assumed the offensive, pursued the enemy, taking a thousand prisoners and capturing eight guns, five of which were obtained by the Sardinians.

Another fight took place at Contrivis, in the province of Bologna, in which the enemy were repulsed by the Division under General Foy of the 1st corps of the French army, after two hours fighting.

Last night the picket of the enemy endeavored to pass the bridge at Carosona, but they were repulsed by the inhabitants of that vicinity. The Austrians have evacuated Vercelli.

Turin, June 1st. - A second victorious conflict occurred at C' stock last evening at Palermo. The enemy endeavored to re-enter but were repulsed by the divisions under Gen. Caldino, composed of the Zouaves and Piedmontese cavalry.

The details of the battle of Palestro say that the Sardinians were at one time outflanked by the Austrians, who threatened the bridge of boats across the Mela, over which Gen. Canrolier was to effect a junction with the King of Sardinia.

On Tuesday the Austrians attacked the Sardinian vanguard at Nostal'vado, and after two hours, our troops pursued the enemy across the Ticino.
