Address of the State Committee.

We publish in this issue of the Spirit the Address of the Democratic State Central Committee. This elaborate yet concise paper boldly and dispassionately meets the issues of the day. In commencing it therefore, to the careful attention of our readers, we not only perform a duty always expected in such cases, but a duty, in this instance, made agreeable by the ability and elevated character of the document.

Seidman, if any period of the past, says the Pennsylvania, has the Democratic party encountered such unrelenting hostility and malvolence as it does at the present moment. A crisis seems to have been reached, not only in its history, but also in that of those which have been and are still its enemies. Since the inauguration of the present National Administration, many important foreign and domestic questions have arisen, in the progress of which, opposition has been met of a character heretofore unparalleled; that opposition not being confined to a single opposing party, but equally engaged in by the representatives of every political view which could be arrayed against the success of Democratic measures. Of these representatives there were those who professed allegiance to the party, but who, however believed it good policy to counteract, and if possible, defeat its measures. Such, in common with its old recognized enemies, used every means, device and misrepresentation, to disaffect the masses and render odious, if possible, an Administration which has achieved for the peace and good order of the nation, the most substantial and important triumphs. In the midst of a warfare wholly unprecedented; in spite of opposition, and even rebellion in the party, every principle upon which the Democratic party and the safety of the Government depend, has been vindicated, sustained and enforced. No issues, where in the dignity, peace or rights of the nation have been involved, being questions of either domestic or foreign policy, now remain unsettled, or remaining so, have not had the impress of this Administration so fixed upon them that, hereafter, nothing short of treason to right and law, can disregard.

It was not unnatural, however, to expect that some disorganization would follow such opposition—that many heretofore reliable party men might be shaken in their faith—and that some disaffection would be produced, which being magnified by those engaged in bringing it about, seemed to threaten the stability or at least the future integrity of the party. This Address, therefore, could not have had a more opportune moment to reach the popular mind, and counteract the poison so lavishly disseminated by the Opposition and faction press. We refrain from canvassing a single doctrine contained in it, and content ourselves by saying that in its spirit, tone, and compass, the Democracy will find all that is desirable in the present stage of the campaign, and nothing that is not in harmony with the stability of the Government and required for peace among the people.

Passports.
Doubts having been entertained in regard to the proper construction of that part of the act of Congress of the 18th of August, 1856, which relates to passports, the Secretary of State, as we understand requested the opinion of the Attorney General upon the subject, which has been given in the letter which we subjoin—
The Constitution.

ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE.
June 22, 1859.
Sir: I have considered your communication on the subject of passports, and am submitting certain questions upon the construction of the twenty-third section of the act of August 18, 1856.

The first question presented is, whether certificates, similar to the one accompanying your letter of May 30, are within the meaning of the law? The paper referred to, purports to have been issued by the Mayor of Philadelphia to a citizen of the United States, describing the personal appearance of the man in whose behalf it is given, and requesting all whom it may concern to permit him to pass freely to pass whosoever lawful papers may call for, in case of need, to give him all lawful aid and protection. This is unquestionably "an instrument in the nature of a passport." It is substantially in the form used by the State Department, and is clearly within the letter of the act.

The second question is, whether the prohibition contained in the 23d section of the act of August 18, 1856, is confined to the issuing and verifying of such papers or certificates in foreign countries, or applies equally to State and Federal authorities issuing them? The corresponding language ("any person acting, or claiming to act, in any office or capacity under the United States, who shall not be lawfully authorized") This embraces State officers. They do not generally reside or act officially abroad. It is therefore, unreasonable to suppose that Congress intended merely to prohibit those from giving certificates in foreign countries. Besides the language of the act is not doubtful. In its natural import it applies as well to acts done here as elsewhere.

I presume the provision that the offender may be tried in the district where he is arrested or in custody has given some encouragement to the idea that the act does not contemplate offences committed within a State. There is nothing else in the law to raise a doubt upon the point; and this is not enough to require a construction which would render the whole legislation on the subject useless.

Another question proposed is, whether a passport can be issued to any other person than a citizen of the United States? The act says in many words that it can not, and I am unable to make the prohibition either stronger or plainer.

It appears that you have been requested to state whether there is any form of certificate which State officers may lawfully issue; and this question also is referred to me. I have not made any effort to devise a plan by which the law may be evaded and simple people defrauded. The impositions practised upon the illiterate and unwary by the fabrication of worthless passports led to the passage of the law which is now under consideration. If there be any form by which it can be rendered abortive, it is neither your duty nor mine to find it out.

Your letter of to-day, enclosing a dispatch from the American Consul at Hamburg, shows how frightfully innocent men have been robbed by the sale of these spurious passports. I advise that the notary who signed the paper which accompanied the dispatch be prosecuted, under the act of 1856. He is clearly within its penal provisions.
