A Word of Caution.—We perceive by the Lancaster paper that on the 11th of April that city was visited by a horde of Pickpockets who were very successful in driving an entire business in their villainous calling. Quite a large amount of money was purloined from the country people by these light-fingered rascals. In some instances persons who had well earned their money, and thought they had it safe in their pockets, lost the entire amount. We think it quite a fortunate circumstance for our country friends that some of these thieving scamps extended their visit to this place on that occasion. Our town was unusually crowded with people on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, and the amount of money transactions much larger than on the first of April of any previous year. We have heard of no losses being sustained by any one in the immense amount that passed from hand to hand on that day. This we think rather remarkable as we used the "precious stuff" very carelessly carried and handled. We saw many persons on our streets, and in crowds, carrying their pocket-books in the breast pockets of their coats, one fourth of the book being displayed with the ends of bank notes sticking out in profusion. Others could be seen at the public corners, in Bar-rooms, on the Court House and Bank steps, and about the offices of our principal lawyers counting and paying over money, thus giving Pickpockets an opportunity to see how the money and where they carried it. When they discovered the Pickpocket "trick" his man, follows him up, and by some wretched trick will throw him off his guard and possess his pocket-book as master who watchful the owner may suppose himself to be. At Lancaster, an old gentleman took his seat at the dinner table of the Hotel declaring that he was too sharp to allow any one to pick his pocket. When he arose from the table he was minus his pocket-book containing a large amount of money. Another man in a crowd was holding his wallet in his pocket with a determined grip, feeling assured that it was on the lock out for pickpockets; an insect, for which he was not on the lock out, just at that moment came baring about his ear and drew his hand out of his pocket to drive it away—he succeeded and on returning his hand to his pocket he found that his wallet had also taken wings and flew away. He is now seated that the "bug" was no bug at all but a *Wasp*. When Gen. Taylor visited this place on his electrifying tour through the country, he was followed by a gang of Pickpockets. The crowd here was very great and many had their pockets rifled when the cry of "Pickpockets in the crowd" was raised and every one instantly grasped their money with a tight hold. A gentleman in the crowd was intently listening to "Old Rough and Ready," and at the same time, as he thought, securely holding his pocket book, when one of the light-fingered brigands braved by him and tramped his toes with the heel of his boot, and while referring the agony of cruel corns he was gently relieved of his pocket book. When relating the occurrence the old gentleman said, with emphasis, that he would not mind the loss of a hundred dollars, the contents of the pocket book, if he could only get satisfaction out of the fellow for tramping his toes. We relate these facts merely to show how dangerous these rogues are in their business and to caution all persons against carrying large sums of money about them in a careless manner, particularly on public occasions, or on going into a crowd. This is in *Coast Week* and quite a large crowd of people, of all sorts, is now in town, and we would say to those having money in their possession to secure it about their person in such a way as to put it beyond the possibility of being abstracted from them by Pickpockets. By attending to our warning it may not only save them their money, but also save them from the shame and mortification of being the dupe of a knave.
