Experiments in Feeding Cattle.

Different experiments have been made in feeding hogs, but the one most deserving notice, was in the State of Maryland. The experiment was conducted by the State, instigated an individual, and the respective merits of two different feedings, and the following is one of the results. On the first of the month of November, four shorthorn sows, some bred, nearly of a size, and as much alike in every respect as could be selected from a herd, were made choice of, each being carefully weighed, and found to be about equal. Their food could be exactly regulated. Two of them weighed together one hundred and eighty five pounds. On the first day of December, while the two fed on much—half the quantity—had gained forty four pounds. The following is said to be an effective remedy for the formidable disease known as the capripox, one ounce whisky or brandy, one ounce diacole. Dose—our-gill, in a half pint of gum arabic, flaviced, or some other mucilaginous tea, given every three or four hours, seldom necessary to give more than three doses. The horse must be kept from water twenty-four hours. Never bled in this disease.

A New Snake Trap. Jan Nichols writes from Meadville, Crawford county Pa., that one of his neighbors has invented a snake trap, which is effectual. It is simply a box, with a movable top, and frames which hold pieces of comb, convenient to remove for examination and destruction of the snake which enters through holes, and deposits its eggs in the comb. This box is placed by the side of the hive, and furnishes a perfect hiding place for the snake, where he goes to deposit his eggs. The theory is that the moth will not attempt to enter the hive while it can find a much better place in the box.
