THE GREAT SANITARY FAIR BUILDINGS.

We herewith present the readers of the Repository with an engraving of the immense buildings erected on Logan Square, Philadelphia, for the Great Sanitary Fair now in progress.

The main buildings are the Art Gallery on the North side, 500 feet long and 40 feet high, the first collection of Paintings and Works of Art ever collected on the Continent.

On the South side there is a space of 90 square feet for Carriages; 180 square feet for Cabinet Ware; 60 feet for a Stage Exhibition room.

Perfumery &c. The Horticultural department is a circular building 190 feet in diameter, and has a Fountain and Fish Pond.

The Fair is still in progress, and the total receipts will fall but little below \$1,000,000.

The Attack on Petersburg—Hard Fought. The 12th Corps (Smith's) were transferred from White House to Petersburg.

WASHINGTON, June 17, 6:30 A. M. The following dispatches have been received by this Department:

Gen. Scott is at Coxson's Hotel, West Point. Since his arrival there he has materially improved in health, and his appetite, which was failing him, is quite restored.

Gen. Crittenden, accompanied by Maj. Buford, Capt. Knox and Capt. McRobert, members of his Staff, have gone to report to Gen. Sherman.

It has been stated that the Ohio hundred-day regiments, which recently arrived in Washington, becoming miffed, refused to go to the front. This is incorrect. They went with as much willingness as any other soldiers during the war.

Gen. Hunter, with Crook's and Averell's forces, left Staunton on the 10th. At that place over three million worth of rebel property was destroyed.

Ex-Chief Justice Hoffman, of New Jersey, the oldest and best men that State has ever produced, died at Newark on the 11th, aged 72. His last words were "Convention—Convention for the freedom of mankind."
