The War—Terrorist Battles

The following dispatches will be seen that there have been two terrible battles between the French and Austrians, in both of which the former were victorious.

The Austrian army was completely routed, and the French entered the city of Milan. The Emperor displayed great bravery during the action, surrounded by his Imperial Guard.

The Austrians evacuated Laveno, abandoning their materials of war, taking shelter in vessels in the Swiss waters. The King attended mass at the cathedral of Milan, on the 9th, when a Te Deum was sung.
